Gone but not forgotten are the servicemen of our country. Pictured above on Veterans Day at the private grave of Sgt. John DiCamp, are Richard Jackie and Steven Bevins, third-graders at the LaGrande School, with their teacher, Mrs. Carl W. Rump and Al Seifert, past commander of the Disabled Americans Veterans, Chapter 7 of Plainfield. A flag of thirteen stars, presented by Mr. Seifert, may be seen in its holder on Sgt. DiCamps gravestone, indentifying him as a veteran of the American Revolution where he fought with the New Jersey Light Dragoons. DiCamp lived on Raritan Road, Scotch Plains. His grave was discovered about twelve years ago during the building of new homes. The visit to this veteran's grave was part of an annual trip conducted each year for third grade school children by Mr. Seifert who has been a public school busdriver for the past ten years.
