### Scotch Plains Arsonists Burn Firebugs, 8-4

Fred Feldman, WOR-Radio's Helicopter Pilot, thrilled 2800 fans at the Donkey Softball game on Saturday. He landed his helicopter at midfield after circling five times. Later, he presented New York Yankee souvenirs to several youngsters selected by lot.

The game was sponsored by

the Rotary Club with the Fanwood Old Man's Softball Assn. Nearly \$2,000 was raised for the Carol Ann Boyd Fund, lifting the total to nearly \$12,500, or roughly 50% of the goal.

The "Fanwood Firebugs" played well but bowed to the "Scotch Plains Arsonists" by a

score of 8-4. Al Derogatis, popular New York Football Giants radio personality, did the play-by-play.
