# 423 GRADUATE FROM SPFHS

"Close beside the Watchung Mountains...stands our school so dear"...And the strains of Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School's Alma Mater echo across the field at tonight's Class of 1967 graduation ceremonies. For the first time, graduates will receive their diplomas at an outdoor program to be held at 6 o'clock on the athletic field. This will enable each senior to invite six guests instead of two as in previous years. In case of rain, ceremonies are scheduled for tomorrow, June 23.

Following a processional, the Reverend Ralph J. Kievit, minister of the Scotch Plains Baptist Church, will offer an Invocation. The National Anthem will be played by the High School Band after which principal, Dr. Perry H. Tyson, will welcome the 423

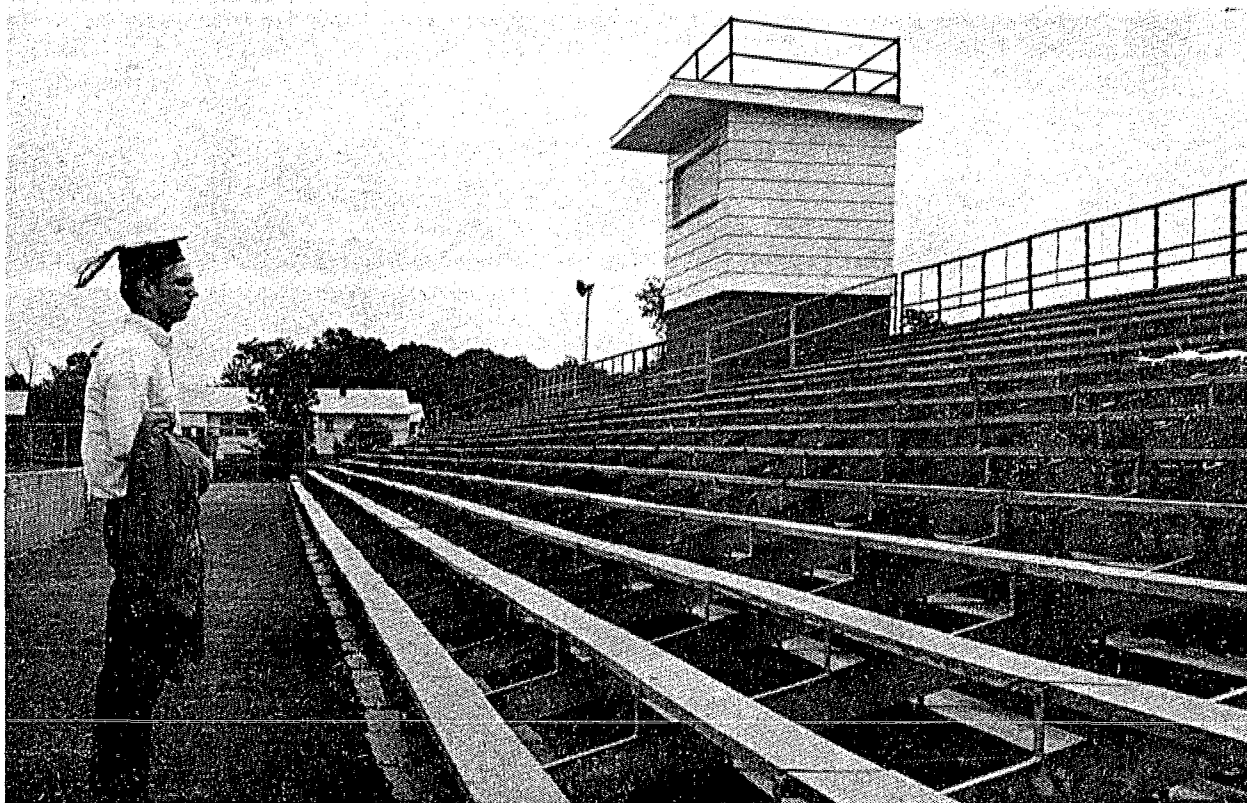
graduates and their guests.

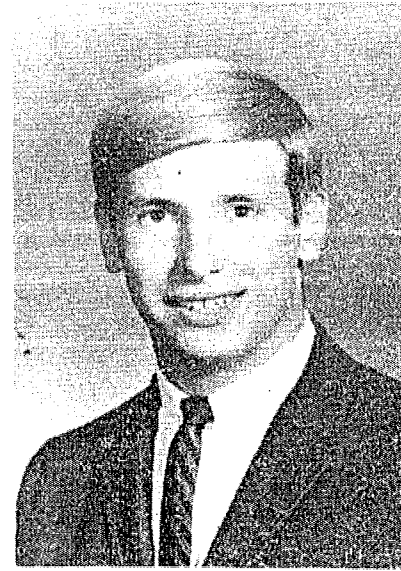
