Star performers confirmed for the show include the Tokens, whose current hit is "Portrait of My Love". Also on the bill are the Breu-Masters, The Road Runners, and the Renaissance Fare (formerly Heets On and the

Towne Squires.) All performers have donated their time. Other groups, not yet finally confirmed, include three TV and recording sensations. These will be announced soon.

The show is scheduled for the Westfield Armory on Monday, July 24 from 7:30 to 11 p.m. Only 3000 tickets can be sold and are available at virtually all local music centers including the Bandstand and Melody Corner in Westfield and Brooks Music Shop and Gregory's Music Center in Plainfield. They are also available at the Fanwood branch of the Plainfield Trust State National Bank.

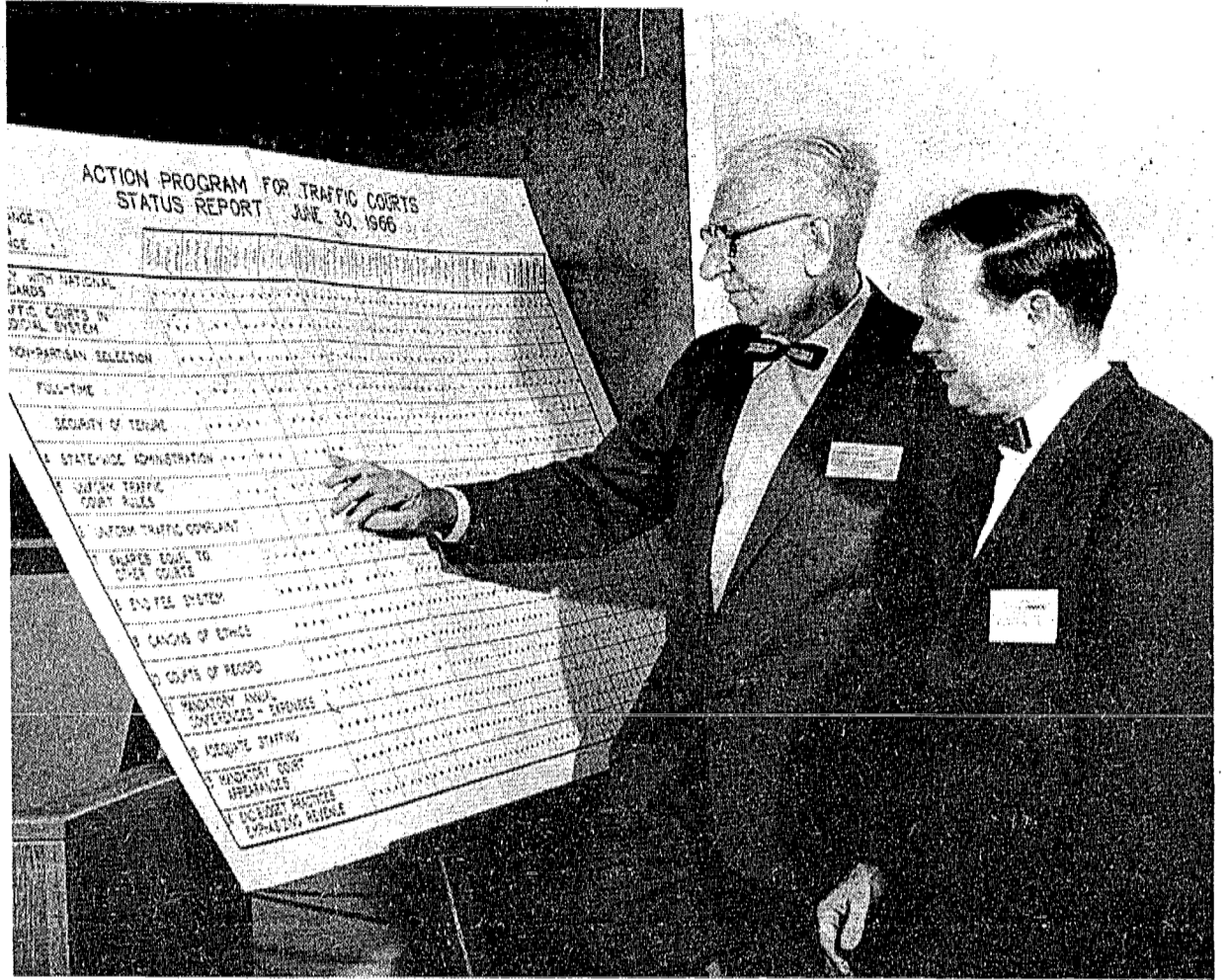
