J. H. Lynch, M. F. Tietze In Fanwood

The Fanwood Democratic Municipal Committee has announced the candidacy of James H. Lynch, Jr. and Melford F. Tietze for nomination of the Democratic Candidates for the Fanwood Borough Council in the September 12 primary election.

Lynch, an alumnus of Rutgers University and Columbia Law School, has been a member of the New York Bar for 8 years. He is Secretary-Treasurer of Gloré Forgan, Wm. R. Staats, Inc., a national investment banking firm. Lynch specializes in legal problems affecting the securities industry and has written many technical publications in this field.

He is a member of the faculty of the New York Institute of Finance, and holds memberships in the American Bar Association and the Association of the Bar of the City of New York. He is also a member of the Columbia Law School Alumni Association, numerous organizations affiliated with the securities industry, and is a veteran of the United States Army.

Lynch and his wife are native New Jerseyites. They, and their two children reside at 74 Arlene Court, Fanwood.

Tietze is a graduate of Stevens Institute of Technology, Hoboken, New Jersey, where he also served as an instructor in the Department of Civil Engineering. He attended Seton Hall University Law School and is a member of the District of Columbia Bar. He has been admitted to practice before the United States Patent Office and the Court of Customs and Patent Appeals, Washington, D.C.

Tietze is Food and Drug Counsel and Trademarks Counsel for Air Reduction Company, Inc., and has served as Division Patent Counsel for this company for several years.

A past officer of the New Jersey Patent Law Association, he is a member of the American Bar Association and of various other professional organizations.

Tietze and his wife have been residents of Fanwood for the past ten years. They, and their five children, reside at 27 Laurel Place, Fanwood.

D. DeCullo Seeks Seat In Plains

The Scotch Plains Democratic Party has announced the candidacy of Dominick L. DeCullo for the Democratic nomination for a 3-year term of the Scotch Plains Township Committee. Selected by a broad-based Democratic screening committee who considered more than 15 persons, DeCullo is the only Democrat seeking the nomination in the September 12 primary.

A lifetime resident of Scotch Plains, and a product of its school system, DeCullo is an independent contractor. He has served two terms on the Board of Education, including Vice President and President of that Board. He was also the Board's liaison to the Planning Board of Scotch Plains.

A World War II veteran, DeCullo is a member of the American Legion Post 209 of Scotch Plains. Other Civic activities include membership in the Scotch Plains Booster Club, executive of the Evergreen PTA, and member of the board of governors of Co. B, Junior Essex Troop of Westfield. He is an active supporter of the Scotch Plains Rescue Squad and is active in many mental health drives. DeCullo is a former trustee of the Italian American Club and has also been a trustee of the Scotch Plains taxpayers group.

DeCullo will be seeking the Township Committee seat now held by Republican William H. Burke, the only local post to be filled in the November election. This will be his second attempt for the office. Commenting on his candidacy, DeCullo stated, "Last year, in the face of a 5,000 vote plurality by national Republican Candidates in Scotch Plains, my margin of loss was only 250 votes. That is why I have accepted the opportunity to run again. As a local business man who spends a great deal of time in Scotch Plains I know the problems and their history. I think the voters are going to give me a chance to do something about them."

Mr. and Mrs. DeCullo reside at 2034 Grand Street, Scotch Plains. Their three sons are graduates of the Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School; their daughter is a student at the Park Junior High.

Republican Assembly candidates Hugo M. Pfaltz, Jr., Summit (seated left) and Peter J. McDonough, Plainfield, (right) are seeking the two District 9-C Assembly seats.
