Freeholders give green light to rebuild Terrill Rd. Bridge

Union County Freeholder Walter E. Boright of Scotch Plains announced that the Board of Freeholders adopted a Resolution notifying the Department of Transportation to proceed with the construction of a new bridge over the Conrail tracks and improvement of the roadway from South Avenue to Midway Avenue in Fanwood and authorizing the closing of Terrill Road bridge during construction. The resolution was introduced by Boright and co-sponsored by Freeholder and Scotch Plains Councilman Alan Augustine.

Boright, a long time advocate for the replacement of the Terrill Road Bridge, stated, "This project has been in the workings for many years. I am extremely delighted that the hard work and long efforts of the Fanwood, Scotch Plains, and Plainfield municipal governing bodies, as well as those of Fanwood Police Chief Anthony Parenti and interested city groups,

are coming to fruition." He also noted, "This project, if it proceeds on schedule, should be complete by early spring 1985. SPFHS students to erect Community Bulletin Bd.

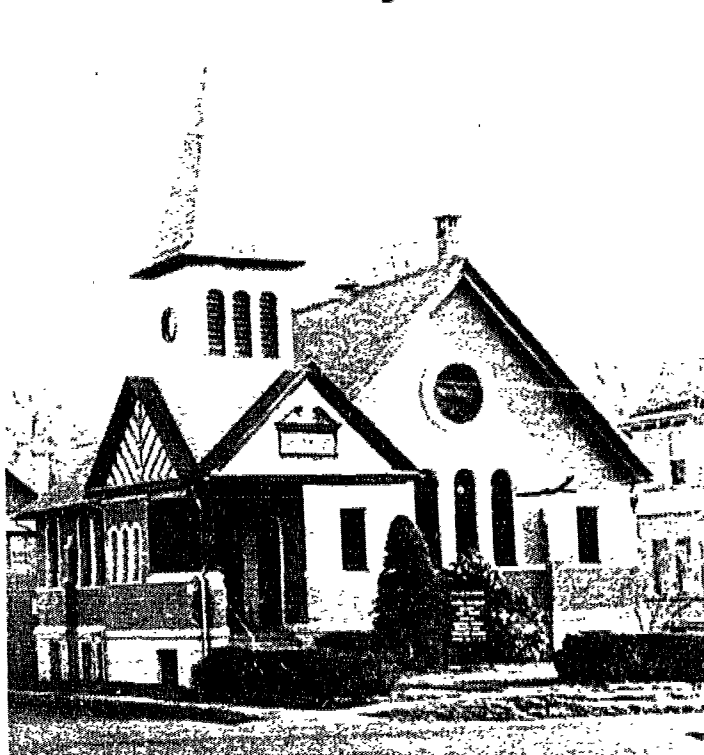

After Planning Board member Eric Hursh read a 19-page resolution into the record at the Board's March 24 meeting, the resolution to approve the application for a new firehouse was unanimously at 11:25 p.m.
