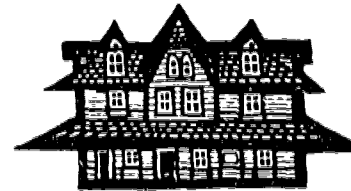

Budget for 1983 adopted by Fanwood Borough Council

The Fanwood Borough Council adopted the budget for 1983 at the May 11 council meeting. Other than the \$58,000 for policemen's salaries, the budget will hold the line at a 5% increase.

A Fanwood homeowner will pay \$2,208 in taxes on a home assessed at \$80,000. A homeowner's portion of the Scotch Plains-Fanwood school tax will be an estimated \$2.75 per \$100 assessed valuation.

Resolutions passed by the council included approval for two weeks leave of absence for Borough Clerk Daniel J. Mason; approval for amusement game licenses for Fanwood Racquetball Club, Fanwood Corner Store and Rocco's Tavern; approval of a peddler's license for Pied Piper Ice Cream Truck; the appointment of Richard G. Barry as architect for the construction of the new fire house and the appointment of Daniel J. Mason as project coordinator for fire house construction.

Ordinances were introduced to appropriate \$10,000 for Carriage House parking lot and sidewalks; \$13,400 for Borough Hall parking lot; second reading to appropriate \$50,400 for storm drainage, curbing and resurfacing Watson Road; \$71,400 for curbing and resurfacing Estelle Lane, Morse Avenue and

Waldon Road and Court, Pleasant

Avenue, Thorne Place, Tower Place and Byron and Mary Lanes. Several residents ex-
