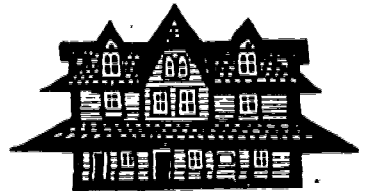

Village Green opener to "Celebrate" public schools

More than just voices, dance steps and instruments will blend in harmony during the June 9 "Celebration of Schools" on the Scotch Plains Village Green. Scheduled for 6:30 to accommodate the younger students performing, this opener for the Scotch Plains Cultural Arts Committee (SPCAC)'s annual summer series is the culmination of months of preparation and cooperation on the part of the SPCAC, the township council and administrative staff, and the school community, as well as other willing volunteers.

All eight of the District's schools will be participating in the two-hour program, which presents a cross-section of the performing arts.

Evergreen School students will present a square dance, taught by Alan Ross, and a 25-piece band under the direction of Joe Sackel. A square dance will also be performed by Brunner School students, whose teacher is Betty Gasiorowski. George Dubroski's Coles School students will

perform a line dance, and Chopin in a Clarinet Ensemble will be offered by Ted Mac Vicar's students. From McGinn School, Tanya Whelan presents a choral group, and a clarinet quartet and trumpet solo. School One's Band will offer pieces under the direction of George Jackson. Students of Ted MacVicar and Ed Green, all from Park and Terrill Middle Schools will give a duet and an oboe Sonata.

The High School's jazz band, the Moonglowers, directed by Vincent Turturiello, will present a 15 minute segment of the program, followed by "Table Music" from Park.

A combined chorus, drawing from Park, Terrill and the High School, will blend their voices under the direction of Laurie Wellman.
