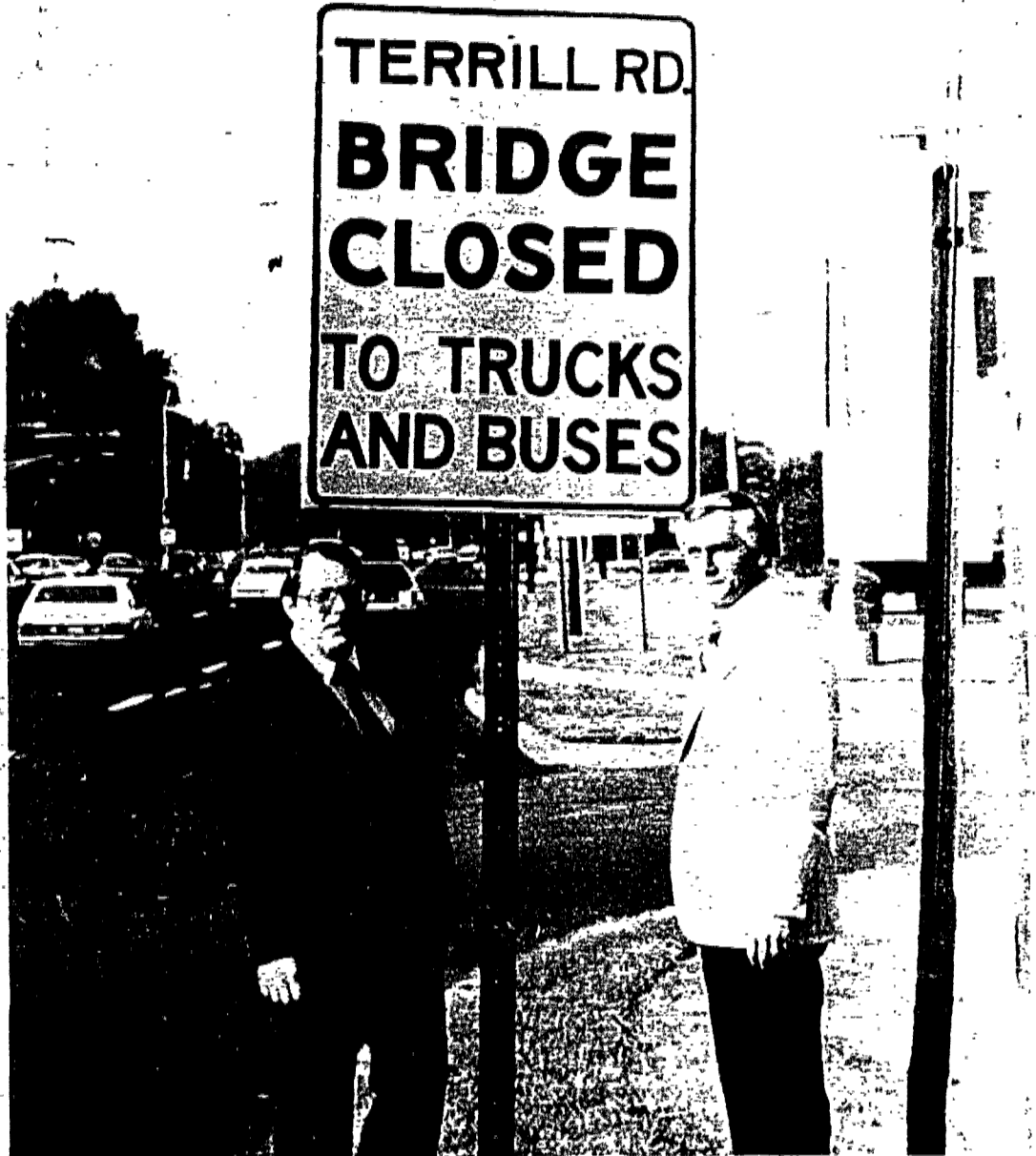
Heavy trucks and buses banned from Terrill bridge

Councilman Paul Abbott, chairman of the Fanwood Public Safety Committee, announced that heavy vehicles can no longer use the Terrill Road Bridge. Abbott said the weight limitation had to be implemented in order to keep the bridge "open and safe" until it is replaced sometime in 1985.

The new limitation is a maximum gross weight of 4 tons. A detour route has been established for vehicles weighing more than 4 tons and the appropriate detour signs have been installed. There is a sign on Route 22 giving the overweight trucks notice of the bridge limitation and "hopefully the trucks will find alternate routes", Abbott said.

The detour route for southbound traffic is right on North Avenue into Plainfield, left on Leland Avenue and left again on South Avenue to Terrill Road. Northbound traffic goes right on South Avenue to Martine Avenue, then left to Midway Avenue and left again to Terrill Road.

Departments will strictly enforce the 4 ton weight limitation on the overpass as well as the other streets in close proximity to the bridge. "It is our intention to attempt to preserve the bridge until it is rebuilt and at the same time we want to maintain the integrity of the residential streets in the area," Abbott said.
