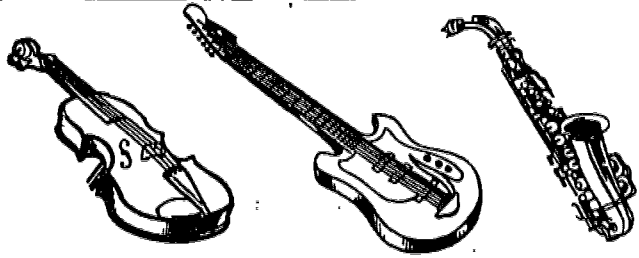

Planning Board hears condo plans at Fan. agenda session

An informal proposal for 19 condo-type units in Fanwood was presented to the Planning Board at their agenda setting session Monday, Aug. 15.

Westfield attorney William Butler, representing developers Robert Rau, Jr., a borough councilman, and Ernest DiFrancesco, asked the board their opinion on the project to be located at Third Street and LaGrande Ave.

The developers have acquired a house at 43 Third Street adjoining the vacant lot at Third and LaGrande, making the total package a little less than one acre. Building and Zoning Official Norman O. Geuder, who sits on the Planning Board, does not think 19 units on that space would be feasible.

"I can see problems with the lay-out," Geuder said. "The 20th lot would be a non-profit association for the maintenance of the property, and with the present plan would be land-locked. If a use variance is needed, this

involves the Board of Adjustment." Geuder felt that the Planning Board was not receptive to the initial rough plan.

Planning Board Chairman Joel Whitaker noted, "and a primary consideration is, do we want row houses on a block in Fanwood." Please turn to page 9

Meandering Mercury mutilates S.P. shrubbery



Last Tuesday a Scotch Plains resident parked his auto in the Scotch Plains municipal parking lot, leaving his motor running while he dashed into Park Pharmacy on Park Avenue.

The auto, acting in its own behalf, jumped into reverse gear, backed up and rammed into the hedge bordering the sidewalk on Park Avenue. The car sustained minor scratches and abrasions, but the five bushes received fatal injuries.

Moral of the story: don't leave your car with the motor running. It could be injurious to your health and your pocketbook as it is a misdemeanor and carries a fine.
