Although March 1 is the date that the N.J. Safety Seat Belt Law goes into effect, the date would lack significance were the public not educated to make the right choice to "Buckle Up For Safety."

PTA Council Safety Chairman Jane Lorber and her Co-Chairman Eileen Morris have seen to it that the Scotch Plains-Fanwood communities have a positive response to the new law through an on-going information program. In a recent interview, Lorber indicated that public awareness regarding the new law is high due to the fact that she and Morris received an overwhelming response to their campaign for support. "Our campaign for public awareness began, of course, with

the individual PTA Safety Chairmen at each school, whose enthusiasm spilled over to the administration, staff, and members of the school community," Lorber points out. Since any informational program depends heavily on visual materials, the Lorber-Morris team set out to get financial backing. "We hesitate to name individuals, lest we slight someone," Morris says. Scotch Plains-Fan. receives \$10,000 software grant

By March, the Scotch Plains-Fanwood communities will have access to a free lending library for computer software. Micro-Ed, a Minnesota-based software company, has donated \$10,000 worth of free software for the Scotch Plains-Fanwood school district with the stipulation that use of the software be outside the classroom, either at home or after school. The concept to enrich knowledge at home or after school at no cost to public libraries or parents. A student will have access to educational software when it is timely. Programs have been selected for the Commodore 64 and VIC 20, as well as for the APPLE, TRS-80, ATARI and TI in proportions determined by a community survey. The software is educational in content, including reading, grammar, math, and reference skills.
