dinances of the municipalities he investigated require 2 spaces per unit and suggested the same be done in Fanwood.

With regard to on-street parking, Yesowitz had noted the availability of space on adjacent streets. The Chief's recommendation to the Board was that parking be disallowed on Third if the condos were built. He added, however, that "LaGrande Avenue cannot handle additional parking and I

wouldn't want to see parking removed from Third Street because of the inconvenience to people already living there and the fact that it would increase speed" on that street.

Residents' problems with the parking situation are twofold: "Parking's at a premium right now", said Third Street resident Chet Skwirut. He also explained the difficulty he presently has in getting out of his driveway. "Too many more parked cars won't be good, but not having any parking at all wouldn't be much better."

Baptist Church dedicates Golden Glide Chairlift



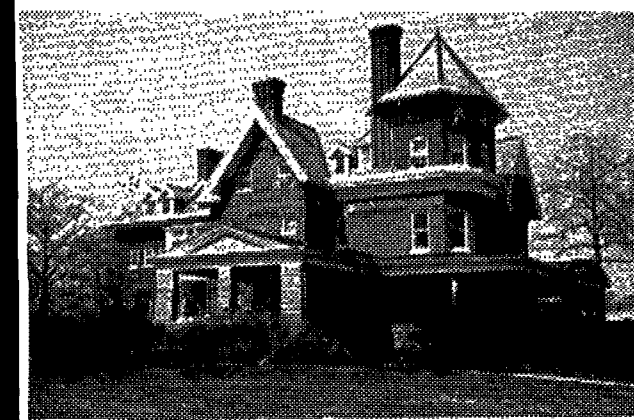

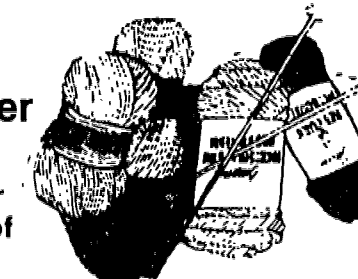
