

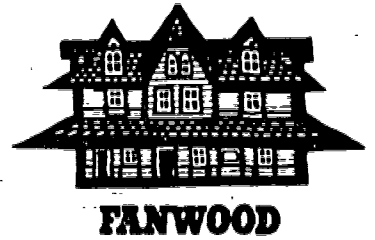

FREE POWDERED MILK & FLOUR FOR ELIGIBLE FANWOOD RESIDENTS

Government surplus commodities of powdered milk and flour will be distributed to eligible Fanwood residents on Tuesday, May 14 at the rear of Boro Hall between the hours of 9:30 and 11:30 A.M. Those eligible include recipients of General Assistance, AFDC, SSI, SSD, Medicaid, Food Stamps or whose income is as follows:

Only one person per household is eligible, since quantities are limited. Each individual must sign attesting that they meet the income eligibility. For further information call the Welfare Office at 322-8236.

GIANT GARAGE-RUMMAGE SALE AT METHODIST CHURCH

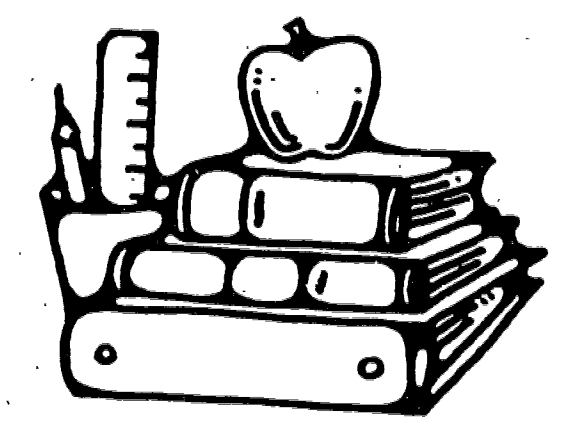

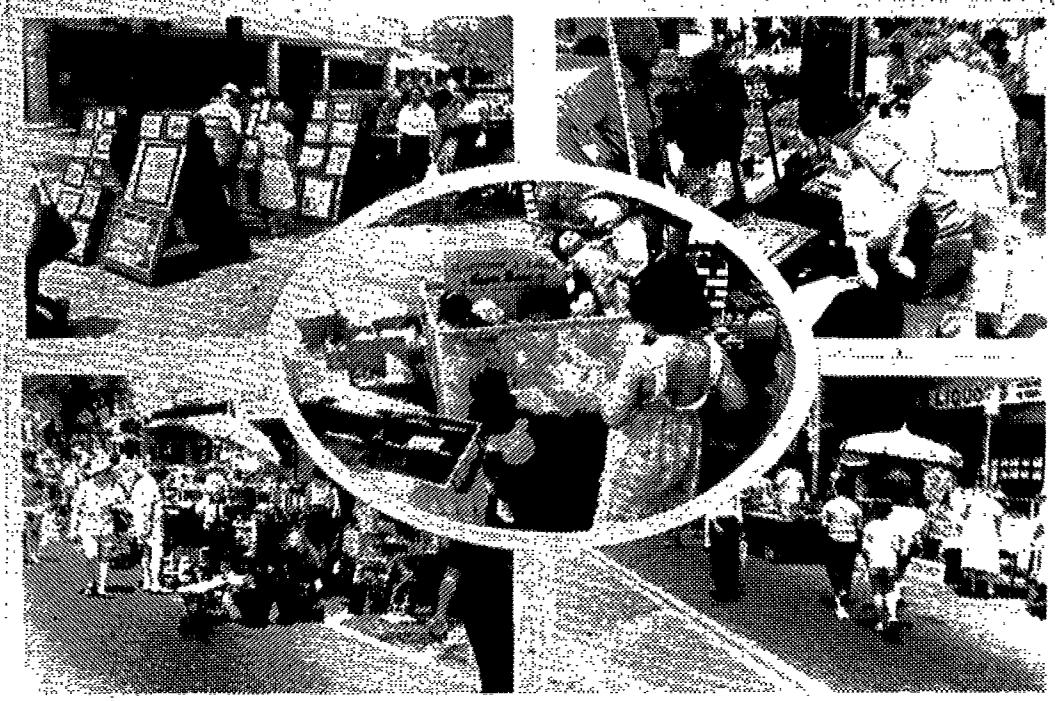
Staff who have served the district in various capacities for 20, 25, 30 and 35 years along with retirees will be honored with pins and certificates.
