## MONTHLY BP SCREENING CLINIC

The Township of Scotch Plains will hold the monthly Hypertension (High Blood Pressure) Screening Clinic on Wednesday, June 12.

The Clinic will be held in the Scotch Plains Public Library Community Room from 4:00-7:00 P.M. and is free. The intent of the clinic is to identify new cases of High Blood Pressure. Those persons who are over the age of thirty and smoke or are overweight or have a family history of heart disease or diabetes and have not had their blood pressure checked recently are urged to attend.

# Parcourse facility slated for Brunner School property

The Brunner School PTA has announced plans to construct a Parcourse facility on the Brunner School property. This major project coincides with an important milestone for Brunner School - its 25th anniversary.

A Parcourse is a series of stations carefully designed to exercise specific parts of the body. The stations are placed in the proper sequence, so participants maintain the correct balance in exercise. At each station, participants are "coached" by signs illustrating what to do and how to use the apparatus provided. The overall layout and recommended exercises of the stations are based on research with National Athletic Health Institute physiologists and sports medicine experts. A Parcourse may be constructed for use both by able-bodied and disabled individuals. Each Parcourse facility provides a safe, scientifically balanced exercise program for all age and fitness levels.

The Brunner Parcourse will have 18 stations - 9 for able-bodied use and 9 for disabled use, existing side by side. All members of the community will be welcome to take advantage of this new fitness resource.

There are two significant aspects of the Parcourse design which greatly enhance the desirability of locating a Parcourse within the community for its use. First, it is designed with recommended exercises appropriate for all ages. Also, the Parcourse is adapted to allow equal access by the handicapped. This makes the Parcourse suitable for virtually all members of the community. The Brunner PTA considered this to be a strong "plus" when it made its decision to construct a fitness facility.

The estimated cost of the project excluding

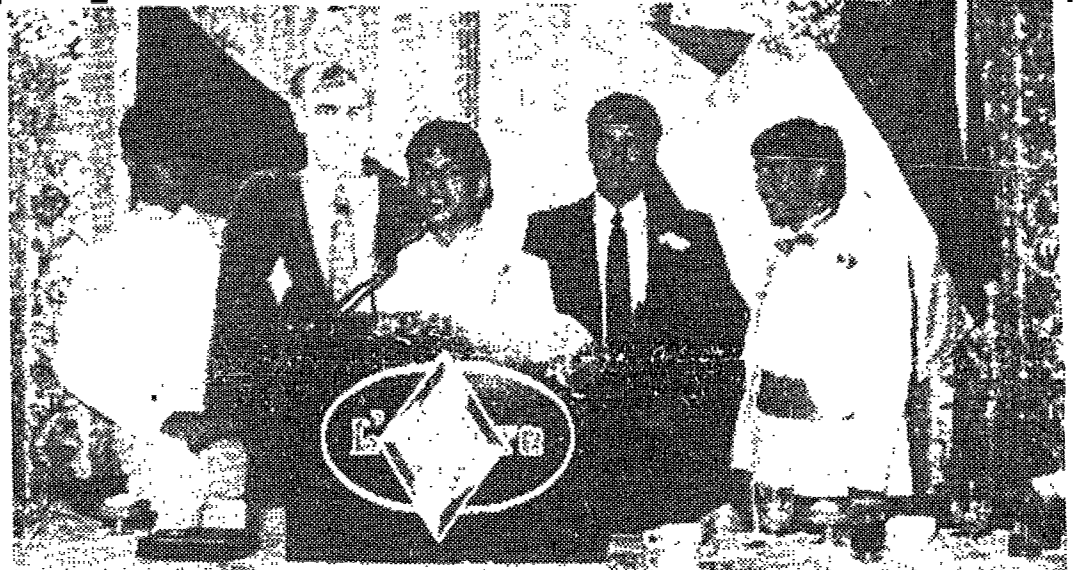
installation is \$9,000. To date, Brunner PTA fundraisers and donations amount to \$4,000. In addition, the Scotch Plains-Fanwood Board of Education has agreed to provide in-

stallation of the Parcourse. To complement this, the Brunner PTA needs the generous support and assistance of the local community. The fundraising period runs through

December, with construction of the Parcourse scheduled for the Spring of '86.
