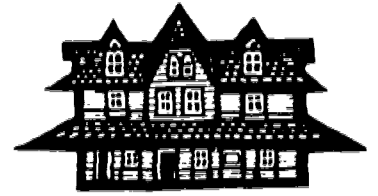

TAXPAYERS WHO GOT EXTENSION MUST FILE RETURN BY AUGUST 15

Calendar year taxpayers who applied for automatic extensions to file their Federal income tax returns must file the completed returns and pay any remaining tax due by midnight, August 15, the Internal Revenue Service said.

If a taxpayer is entitled to the automatic two-month extension that is allowed because he or she was outside the U.S. or Puerto Rico on April 15, a statement to that effect must be attached to the return, the IRS added.

For additional information regarding extension of time to file, taxpayers may call the IRS Forms/Tax Information number listed in the local telephone directory or write the IRS.

Germinder marks 30 years with Fan. P.D.



CAPT. GEORGE E. GERMINDER

August 1, 1985 is a milestone for Capt. George E. Germinder of the Fanwood Police Department. It is the 30th anniversary of Capt. Germinder's employment with the Borough of Fanwood.

Born and raised in Elizabeth, Capt. Germinder graduated from Thomas Jefferson High School. He served 18 months in Korea with the 25th Infantry Division and was awarded a Unit Citation and a Battle Star. He returned from Korea in 1952 and moved to Fanwood with his family.

He was appointed a patrolman with the Fanwood Police Department on August 1, 1955. During the next 30 years he attended numerous professional schools including the Northwestern University School of Police

Management. His advancement to sergeant occurred in 1969. He served in that position until 1970 when he was promoted to the rank of lieutenant. He was advanced to his present position in 1975 and is presently responsible for the Patrol Division. In the absence of the Chief of Police he assumes responsibility for the entire department. Capt. Germinder's dedication to the Borough of Fanwood and its residents goes beyond his law enforcement career. He is a volunteer member of the Fanwood Fire Department and the Fanwood Rescue Squad. He is an active member of the Fanwood Lions Club. He also holds membership in various civic and professional organizations. Please turn to page 4
