Mayor Patricia Kuran will introduce two guests on Suburban Cablevision's Channel 3 on Tuesday, Nov. 5, at 6:30 p.m. The first of the guests will be Norman O.Geuder, Sr., Construction Official for the Borough of Fanwood since Jan. 1, 1977.

Mr. Geuder, who has served on the Planning Board for 20 years, will discuss construction projects within the Borough and will detail which home improvement projects require permits under State statute or Borough code.

S.P. sets hearing on Revenue Grant

Mayor Gabriel Spera announced a public hearing will be held on the Union County HUD Revenue Sharing Block Grant Twelfth Year funding on November 7, at the Municipal Building, 430 Park Avenue, Scotch Plains, at 7:30 p.m.

"We are setting our own priorities and want to know how our citizens feel about the County allocation should be spent," said Mayor Spera.

Scotch Plains has benefited from Community Development Revenue Sharing funds since 1975 amounting to more than \$1,700,000. It is expected that approximately \$5,000,000 will be available to Union County for twelfth year funding.
