The meeting agenda will cover reorganization of the local United Way to ensure continued support for the member agencies. A new base of volunteers is also needed. The coming year will see renewal of

the United Way of Scotch Plains, its merger with another local United Way, or its demise.

The United Way of Scotch Plains, formerly the Scotch Plains Community Fund, has existed since 1944. Its main purpose has been to raise funds from the community for distribution to member health, recreational, and social agencies serving the citizens of Scotch Plains. The heart of the United Way effort has been the volunteers who have raised funds, reviewed agencies for membership, and determined the fair distribution of funds among the agencies.
