Memorial Day Parade to pay special tribute to Lady Liberty

On Monday, May 26, 1986 the communities of Fanwood and Scotch Plains will hold their traditional annual Memorial Day Parade. More than 50 local organizations have signed up to make this year's parade a special tribute to Lady Liberty and what this symbol of freedom means to us.

Antique cars, a total of eight floats and seven bands, including the high school marching band, drill teams and twirlers will be featured at the parade.

The parade will also mark the first public appearance of Miss Union County, Lindsey Wood of Scotch Plains, who was selected at Saturday night's pageant as well as Adrienne Perfilio of Scotch Plains, Union County's Junior Miss for 1986.

In announcing its preliminary plans, the

Memorial Day Parade Committee gave special thanks to the High School's DECA Chapter and the Scotch Plains Chamber of Commerce for their special contributions. The Chamber of Commerce is sponsoring Rick Richards Dixieland Band for the enjoyment of the community.

Budget approved at Fan. Council meeting

At the regular meeting of the Mayor and Council held on May 14, the Council adopted their 1986 budget after second and final reading and amendment which accommodated additional insurance expenses. The budget of \$3,050,565.49 includes \$1,271,237.33 to be raised by taxation for municipal purposes, 8 points are attributed to insurance increases. The Council voted 4 to 2 for approval with Councilwoman Swindlehurst and Councilman Pickering voting against acceptance of the budget.

HONEY & SKIM MILK AVAILABLE IN SCOTCH PLAINS
Surplus honey and skim milk will be available to eligible Scotch Plains residents on May 22 and May 23. The surplus commodities will be given out to residents who receive AFDC, Food Stamps, SSI, WIC, and Medicaid. Also eligible are households with incomes under the federal guidelines. The income limitations are \$9,713 for a one person household, \$13,043 for a two person household, \$16,373 for a three person household, and up to \$26,363 for a household with six persons. Honey and skim milk will be given away Thursday and Friday, May 22 and May 23, in the CD Room downstairs from 9:00 a.m. to noontime each day.
