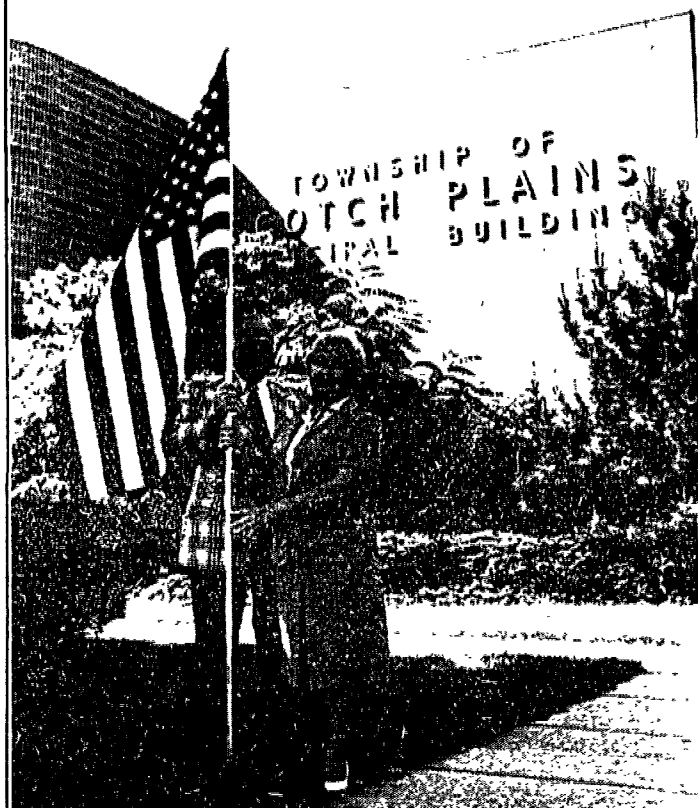

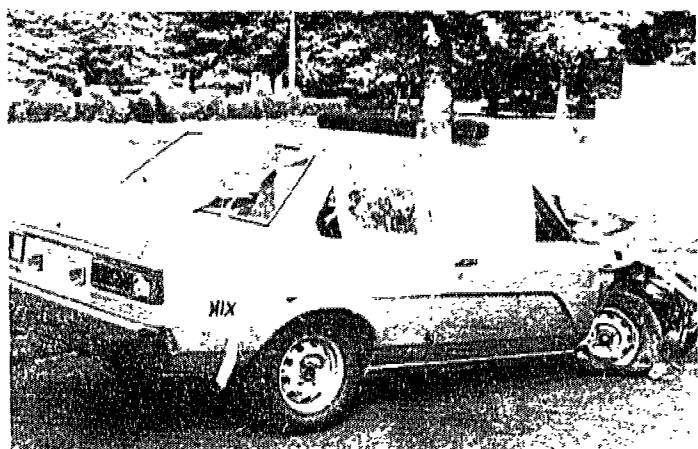

Waste & traffic concern Council

Fanwood Council last week passed a resolution opposing the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection's recent mandate to establish waste transfer stations and the Department's plan to cart refuse out-of-state. Doubling the cost effectiveness of constructing transfer stations less than four years before the opening of a county resource recovery plant, Councilwoman Barbara Swindlehurst stated: "Stop-gap measures will not save money...If we're going to pay, let's pay for something lasting."

Councilmembers questioned the necessity of paying high fees to haul waste material out of New Jersey when the potential exists for re-opening of landfills not yet at their Please turn to page 17
