'86 Election Results GOP is winner in Scotch Plains Fan. names Democrat & Republican



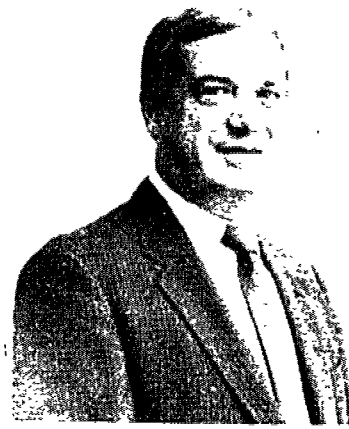

In Scotch Plains Republican incumbents made a clean sweep Tuesday as voters returned three GOP's to their seats on the township council.

Joan Papen, serving as mayor this year, received the largest number of votes with 3,155. Following close in line were Gabe Spera 3,125 and Irene Schmidt 3,101. All three were re-elected to four-year terms.

Ben Mond, Joseph Vogel and Dorothy Dallah garnered 2,721, 2,611 and 2,558 respectively.

"I'm very thrilled the intelligent residents of Scotch Plains were not fooled by the deceitful tactics of our opponents," Papen said. "We can now devote our thoughts to our jobs."

"We have done a very good job and the results reflect it," Spera remarked. He said the council has made great progress in successfully fighting the Mount Laurel case, revitalization of the business district and senior citizen's needs.

"This victory was a repudiation of gutter politics displayed by leadership of the opposition," Spera said.

Schmidt is quoted as saying "I am delighted to have an opportunity to serve the people of Scotch Plains again." She said the Republicans conducted a high-level campaign and the results proved it.

Republicans remain in control of the council 3-2.

Of the township's 12,764 registered voters, a total of only 5,949, or 47 percent went to the polls.

Fanwood voters went to the polls in a light turnout to elect one Democrat and one Republican to borough council. Out of the 4,836 registered, 2,228 made it to the polls to cast their ballots this year.

Democrat Maryanne S. Connelly and Republican William S. Winey were victorious for three-year terms. The win gives the Republicans a 5-1 majority on the borough council.

Connelly gathered the most votes with 1,154. Winey took 1,100 and Republican running mate Larry Naldi garnered 1,100. Democratic incumbent David Pickering had 1,041 votes.

Rinaldo easily beat Democrat National Committeewoman June S. Fischer, a resident of Scotch Plains, by a 7th district vote of 96,474 to 24,524 respectively. In Fanwood Rinaldo polled 1,774 to Fischer's 563 and in Scotch Plains Rinaldo's total was 4,325 to Fischer's 1,261.
