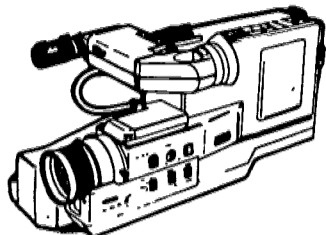

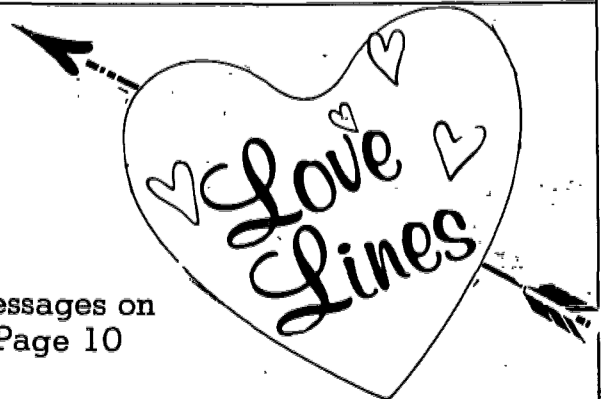
## BD. TO HEAR PRESENTATION BY KINDERGARTEN COMMITTEE

## Judge Melvin Whitken appointed to Superior Court

It was like old home week for Judge Melvin Whitken when he was sworn in as state Superior Court Judge on Feb. 3 in Elizabeth.

Judge Whitken, a Fanwood resident who served as the borough's Municipal Court Judge for the past 17 years, was raised in the Elmora section of Elizabeth, where his father had been a school principal.

A graduate of Thomas Jefferson High School in Elizabeth, Judge Whitken later studied at Rutgers University (Class of '59) and Seton Hall Law School. He worked in the Public Defender's Office in Elizabeth after college and practiced law there until 1973. Judge Whitken was a partner in the law

## Scotch Plains Chief announces "Seniors Housing Program"

Chief Robert Luce in conjunction with the Union County Division of Aging is pleased to announce the implementation of the Senior Citizens Safe Housing Program.

The aim of this program is to increase the safety features of the homes of citizens 60 years of age and older.

Interested citizens are to contact the Scotch Plains Police Department Crime Prevention Officer, Detective Andrew Glaydura; (322-7100), to make arrangements for a home security survey. When the survey is completed a work order form will be submitted to the Department of Human Services. An outreach worker will then visit residences and have release forms signed by the home owner for the installation of the security equipment. Following this, professional contractors will be assigned to install the security devices. Upon completion of the job the Crime Prevention Officer will verify the completed work and send a certification of work form to the Division of Aging.

Who is eligible? Any person 60 years of age or older who resides in Scotch Plains in a private home or multiple home dwelling. Senior Citizen Housing residents are not eligible.

What are the costs involved? Safety enhancements up to \$200.00 will be provided at no charge to the resident. Costs which exceed \$200.00 will be paid in full if the resident's income is

less than \$13,650.00 for a single person; \$16,750.00 for a married couple. Persons with incomes above these limits must pay 25% of the amount over \$200.00.
