- All releases should be typed and double spaced. If you don't have the equipment for this, legible printing is acceptable.
- DO NOT CAPITALIZE entire press release—use capital letters only where appropriate.
- Include your name, daytime telephone number and the preferred date of release.
- There is no charge for press releases, except for weddings, birth announcements, and engagements.
- Articles and photos for any event you would like to have in the paper are welcome.
- The Times reserves the right to edit or reject any letters to the editor.
- News releases will not be taken over the phone. Deadline for copy is Monday, 12:00 noon for the week of publication.
- Do not submit information on small pieces of paper.
- Photographs reproduce best if they are clear, black and white. However, color photos will be accepted and used if they are of good quality. The size of the picture does not matter—it can be enlarged or reduced in reproduction. To have your photograph returned, please send a self-addressed, stamped envelope. If you pick it up in person have the issue date that the picture appeared in the paper.
- Identify photographs on a separate piece of paper by indicating where each person named is located in the picture—left to right, top row, etc.
- Do not send in flyers of coming events. Articles must be submitted in press release form—the way you would like it to appear in print.
- We do our best to have timely publication of all articles and pictures submitted by our readers. Thank you for your cooperation and patience.

Meet Fanwood's new Municipal Court Judge

Susan N. Mullen of Westfield became Fanwood's new Municipal Court Judge on March 1, filling the vacancy created by the elevation of Judge Melvin Whitken to the state Superior Court last month.

Mullen took the oath of office from Judge Whitken in his courtroom in Elizabeth. Attending the swearing-in ceremony were Fanwood Mayor Patricia Kuran, borough Public Safety Commissioner Maryanne Connelly, Judge June Robinson Gross, Chief Municipal Court Judge for Union County, Judge Mullen's husband, Robert Mullen, their son Paul, 22, and daughter Sarah, 9, the youngest of the five Mullen children.

Judge Mullen was chosen for the position by Mayor Kuran and the Fanwood Borough Council.

Raised in New York City, Judge Mullen has lived in Westfield with her

family for 26 years. She attended Barnard College, Columbia University, and graduated from Seton Hall University Law School in 1962. The part-time position of municipal court judge allows Judge Mullen to remain a partner with the law firm of Buttermore, Please turn to page 15
