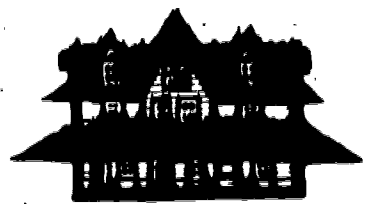

SPRING LEAF & GUMBALL PICK-UP IN SCOTCH PLAINS

On April 10th at 7:00 a.m. the Township Public Works crews will begin the Spring Leaf and Gumball Pick-up. All leaves and gumballs must be curbside in windrows by 7:00 a.m. since we only go through the town once and very quickly. It only takes about 5 days to complete this sweep so please cooperate and have them out. **NO BAGS PLEASE!**

Only leaves and gumballs will be picked up, no branches or shrubs or other debris will be picked up.

We will begin with a loader crew and vacuum crew on each side of town and once the pick-up is completed a sweeper will follow up to sweep up the streets.

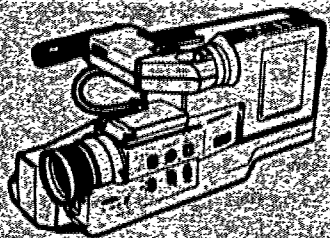

School Election Results

Budget passed; Marionni, Syvertsen & Reilly win seats

The 1989-90 school budget was passed, while one incumbent retained her seat and two newcomers were elected Tuesday in a bid for three-year positions available on the Board of Education.

Incumbent Lee Reilly, won the only Fanwood seat, receiving 654 votes while her opponent James

Grover garnered 310.

In Scotch Plains, successful candidates Roland Marionni and Albert Syvertsen won their seats with 1,050 and 1,015 respectively. Other results are as follows: Kirk Rhodes, 947; Albert Rees, 892.

The \$30+ million current expense budget was passed with 1,815 "Yes"

against 1,221 "No" votes. The capital outlay portion received 1,778 "Yes" as opposed to 1,237 "No" votes.

When the ballots from both communities were tallied, the results showed a turnout of 3,313, an increase of 500 over last year's count.

Dr. Robert Howlett, superintendent of schools,

was pleased with the voter turnout. "It's one of the largest I remember. People worked hard to have an informed electorate. The Budget Steering Committee, made up of PTA and community organization members, presented a tight budget—a lot of effort went into it. The result was overwhelmingly affirmative," stated Howlett.

Snuffy's bartender guilty... penalty assessed

The Scotch Plains Town Council held a special meeting on March 29 to conduct a hearing on complaints dealing with serving minors at Snuffy's Steak House Restaurant. The incident in question occurred on October 14, 1988 when two juveniles, ages 15 and 16 were served alcoholic beverages at a sweet sixteen party. One of the teenagers was found unconscious in a car parked in Snuffy's lot. She required medical attention. The bartender who served the minors was tried in Scotch Plains Municipal Court and found guilty.

"We as Township Council Members, have the legal responsibility as the local Alcohol and Beverage Control to properly consider charges that have been made and assess them appropriately," said Mayor Joan Papen. The Council therefore determined that a 10 day suspension of Snuffy's liquor license was appropriate action for the offense. Mr. Pantagis, owner of Snuffy's, stated

that the N.J. State A.B.C. reduced the penalty to a fine because this is a first offense. The fine is to be determined by a percentage of Snuffy's gross liquor sales.

"The law is quite clear

about the responsibility of an establishment which serves liquor to underage individuals. The law addresses those serving the liquor and the owner of the establishment even if he or she is not present,"

said Papen.

Mayor Papen considers the entire incident to be an unfortunate one. "Mr. Pantagis tries to make sure that no one under age does drink," Papen said.
