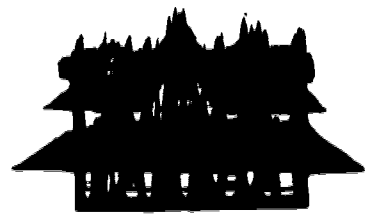

## Democrats win in Union County

Democratic candidates won the majority of votes within Union County during the November 7th elections. Democrat Jim Florio won a landslide victory over Republican candidate Jim Courter in the race for Governor. Florio earned 62% of the vote compared with Courter's 38%. Democrats won the three seats remaining on Union County Board of Freeholders to give the Democrats complete control of the Board as they will hold all nine seats. Walter McLeod, Rahway Councilman; Casimir Kowalczyk, Elizabeth Councilman and Elmer Ertl, former Roselle Mayor will join the Board in 1990. Republican Mayor, Joan Papen of Scotch Plains ran unsuccessfully for Freeholder.

Two seats on the Fanwood Town Council were available this election. Incumbent Councilwoman Maryanne Connelly was elected with 1,635 votes and Chester Lindsay received 1,433 votes. Both will serve 3 year terms.

### FREE FLU IMMUNIZATION PROGRAM IN FANWOOD

Please be advised that a free Flu Immunization Program has been scheduled for Tuesday, November 14, 1989 from 2:00-3:00 p.m. to be held in the Fanwood Municipal Building, 75 N. Martin Avenue, Fanwood.

The program is open to any residents of Fanwood, Garwood, Mountainside or Westfield.

Please note that annual flu vaccination is strongly recommended for the following individuals:  
1) All persons (children and adults who are at increased risk of infections at the lower respiratory tract due to pre-existing conditions), such as:  
a) Acquired or congenital heart disease;  
b) Any chronic disorder or condition affecting respiratory function;  
c) Chronic kidney disease;  
d) Diabetes;  
e) Chronic anemia;  
f) Conditions or therapy which would lower an individual's resistance to infections.  
2) For Senior Citizens, particularly those 55 years of age or over, who are at increased risk to medical problems as a result of Flu infection.

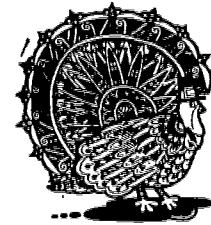
