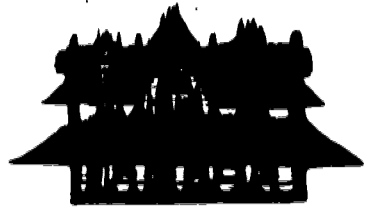

Soccer Skills & Drills

"Soccer Skills and Drills, Inc.," a year round soccer tutoring school for all ages, is opening the week of January 7 in the Scotch Plains area. While the concept of soccer tutoring may be new to local soccer enthusiasts, school director Tom Turnbull has been kicking this idea around for a long time.
