Senior Citizen of the Year nominations being sought

The annual search to discover the outstanding male and female senior citizen of the year based on services performed last year by residents has commenced. Any person can be nominated by a fellow club member, a neighbor, etc. All nominees must have reached 60 years of age by January 1, 1992, and must be residents of Scotch Plains. Volunteerism in hospitals, nursing homes, schools, church work, etc., are all areas of service whether in the community or outside it. Nomination forms are available in the Recreation Office, Room 113, Municipal Building. Nominations must be received no later than April 3rd. All nominations will be evaluated by an Ad Hoc Committee and the outstanding male and female senior will be publicly honored at the Commission Meeting on May 11th.

A trip to the Easter Show

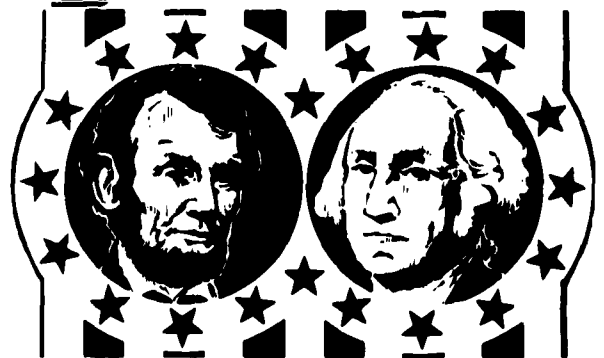

Scotch Plains/ Montazzoli, Italy sister city project announced

A project which would weld Scotch Plains and Montazzoli, Italy into "sister cities" was announced by Scotch Plains Mayor Irene T. Schmidt during the regular Township Council meeting this past Tuesday evening at the Municipal Building. She said that while the meeting was going on, the sister-city committee was holding its first session to determine how

the project would proceed.

The committee consists of Mayor Schmidt, former mayors Mauro Checchio and Gabe Spera, and Marisa Angelozzi, Camillo Angelozzi, Peter DiNizo, Amerigo Checchio, Nick Fabiano, Joseph Appezato, Ron Marcovecchio, Toni Rollis, Laura Swidersky and Tom DeNizio. They

discussed what steps were necessary to establish the relationship, the history of the immigration of some Montazzolians to Scotch Plains starting before the turn of the century and other pertinent items.

At the council meeting, an ordinance was passed which permitted Scotch Plains firemen who moved out of the township but remained within a close

geographical proximity to continue as members of the department.

With Al Steinberg becoming the new Township Director of Finance, Township Manager Tom Atkins was able to be relieved of that additional duty. The Finance Director is responsible for the treasury, assessments and collections for Scotch Plains. The Council thanked Mr. Atkins for his extra effort over the past 6½ years.

In other business, Roger Shults was appointed an alternate representative to the Revenue Sharing Committee. This committee is involved with obtaining monies for the township from the county.

The mayor proclaimed February as PTA month and cited the wonderful work that organization has done since its inception in 1897. She urged all those who are interested in the education and well-being of children to join a local PTA.

In the "Address From The Floor" portion of the meeting, Skip Ungar announced that the "Thank You For Not Smoking" signs were being delivered this week to business and professional offices and stores throughout Scotch Plains by the high school D.E.C.A. organization along with members of the high school PTA.
