## Townwide Clean-Up will begin on June 1st

The Township of Scotch Plains will have Townwide Clean-up beginning with Section One on June 1st. All materials must be out on the first day of your scheduled area. The clean-up will be done by Dependable Disposal.

The contractor will go through an area one time only. It is not known where he will start, so residents should have materials out by the curb at 7:00 a.m. on the first day of your area. Section two will start on the 8th, Section three June 15th, and Section four on June 22, 1992.

Acceptable materials must be placed at the curb before 7:00 A.M. of the first clean-up day scheduled for the district. Your street may be first.

The contractor will cover each street only once. For that reason, it is important that materials to be picked up are at the curb, ready for collection, on the first day.

Residents are urged to cooperate by: promptly reporting any unauthorized scavenging to the police, 322-7100; promptly reporting anyone scattering debris put out for pick-up to the police; and obeying and carrying out regulations as set forth.

Cooperation by all residents is urged to insure a prompt, efficient and orderly Spring Residential Clean-Up. Questions may be directed to the Department of Public Property, 322-6700 ext. 243.

### MATERIALS THAT WILL BE PICKED UP (not restricted to those listed)

Furniture, refrigerators, stoves, appliances, rugs, clothing, toys, screens, doors, storm screens, storm

doors, windows, storm windows, painting material, garden tools, car tires (remove rims), branches (tied), garden and lawn trimmings, leaves (bagged), wooden

fence (cut in 4 foot lengths), metal fence and posts (not heavier than 50 lbs., cut in 4 foot lengths).

### MATERIALS THAT WILL NOT BE PICKED UP

Ashes, rocks, stones, dirt, garbage, stumps, tree trunks, logs, concrete, pool filters, railroad ties, no type of automobile drum, tires with rims, auto parts (other than tires), materials resulting from: demolition, alterations, or repairs to building and other structures.

### REGULATIONS

Small loose items will be picked up only if suitably placed in stable containers with total weight not to exceed 50 pounds.

Branches and like items will be picked up only if tied in bundles not to exceed 50 pounds and four feet in length.

Doors on cabinets, appliances, and refrigerators must be removed as a safety precaution, especially for the safety of children.

Swings, monkey bars and like items must be dismantled and cut to a maximum of four feet in length.

All acceptable materials must be placed at the curb before 7:00 am of the first clean up day scheduled for the section.

Your street may be first. The contractor will cover each street only once. For that reason, it is important that materials to be picked up are at the curb ready for collection on the first day scheduled for your section.
