## AFS chooses student to study in Spain

Linda Ulanet, newly elected president of the Scotch Plains-Fanwood AFS Adult Chapter, announced that Bram Poquette, a student at Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School, has been selected to spend his junior year as a student in Spain.

Poquette will attend the S. Isidoro de Sevilla school in Madrid, and will live with the family of Bienn Rodriguez. He will fly over on August 28 and begin his studies shortly thereafter. He was awarded a scholarship by the chapter and says he is looking forward to this experience with great excitement and eagerness.

This year, AFS exchange student Adham K. Rehim of Cairo, Egypt, spent his senior year here at SPFHS. Adham lived with the family of Scotch Plains Councilman George Brown. After a week's bus tour of the northeast, Adham will return to Cairo on July 9 where he will begin college in the fall.

In two years, he hopes to return to the United States and finish his col-

lege career here. He stated that he had a great time in America and had learned much about our culture. He said he made many friends with whom he intends to keep in touch, and that he felt the student exchange program could only enhance relationships among the various peoples of the world.

The local AFS chapter

is looking for families interested in hosting foreign students for the coming school year. Ulanet commented that the AFS organization was unique in that hosting families had great support from the local adult chapter and the student was made welcome by the high school AFS club.

## Plastic bottle recycling begins in Scotch Plains

Union County Utilities Authority Chairman Angelo J. Bonanno has announced that the Authority will begin collecting plastic bottles at curbside in Scotch Plains this month.

Collection, which will coincide with the recycling schedule, will begin on the northside of town on Tuesday, July 14, 1992 and on the southside of

town on Wednesday, July 15, 1992.

"The Authority has been eager to add plastic bottles to the curbside collection," Bonanno said. "In May we began a pilot plastic bottle curbside collection program in Roselle Park. In June we began to collect plastic bottles at curbside in Garwood and Winfield. Ultimately, plastic bottles will be col-

lected at curbside in each of the towns that participate in the Regional Curbside Recycling Program."

Plastic bottles must be rinsed with all caps and lids removed. All bottles should be flattened. Only plastic bottles that contain pourable liquids, such as milk, soda, or detergent, will be accepted. Squeeze bottles, plastic containers holding hazardous materials, food containers, packaging or plastic wrap will not be accepted. Acceptable materials will have a PETE, PET, or HDPE mark or the number 1 or 2 in a triangle imprinted on the bottom of the bottle.

Plastic bottle recyclables must be set out separately in sturdy, reusable containers. Materials placed in plastic or paper bags will not be collected.

Once recycled these plastic materials can be used in a variety of items including, carpeting, clothing, insulation, drainage pipes and boat hulls.

The UCUA's Regional Curbside Recycling Program, which began in 1987, services Berkeley Heights, Cranford, Garwood, Mountainside, New
