Senator DiFrancesco named outstanding State Legislative Leader

Washington, D.C. - More than 2,000 state legislators, public policy experts, senior corporate executives, and senior state and federal officials met in Colorado Springs for the American Legislative Exchange Council's (ALEC) 19th Annual Meeting on August 5-9.
