## ★ 1992 ELECTION RESULTS ★

### Scotch Plains Republicans score victory

Republican incumbents William McClintock and Alan Augustine easily defeated Democrats Barbara Schwartz and Charles Lamb for two 3-year seats on the Scotch Plains Town Council. Last November, McClintock also defeated Schwartz in the race for a one-year unexpired term on the Council. This is also Lamb's second attempt to win election. He was defeated in 1990 when he ran with fellow Democrats Ed Kahn and Harold Burwell.

McClintock has served

as a council member since March 1991 when he was appointed to replace Joanne Spatola. Former Republican Councilwoman Spatola resigned last February when she was appointed a Union County judge. McClintock served on the Scotch Plains Planning Board from 1983-1986 and was Vice-Chairman of the Scotch Plains Environmental Commission. Currently, he is a library board trustee and a member of the Scotch Plains Local Assistance Board.

McClintock graduated from Oberlin College and received a master's degree from New York University. He is a senior vice-president and chief financial officer for Addison Corporate Annual Reports, Inc.

Currently both a Scotch Plains Councilman and Union County Freeholder, Augustine's record includes 16 years on the Council and eight years on the Freeholder Board. He is a member of the Union County College Board of Governors and Runnells

### Connelly and Walsh make council history in Fanwood

Council President Maryanne Connelly and former Borough Councilman Bruce Walsh make Borough council history this week by capturing majorities in all seven voting districts. Connelly and Walsh defeated Republican opponents Louis Jung and Joel Whitaker for the two 3-year Council seats. Council President Connelly was re-elected to her third three-year term. Mr. Walsh previously served on the Council from 1988-90.

Councilwoman Connelly has served as Council President for the past five years. She has also been police commissioner since 1987. Connelly, an AT&T division manager for corporate human resources is credited with fighting to

protect the integrity of Fanwood's neighborhoods from high density housing, successfully negotiating P.B.A. contracts since 1987, reorganizing the Borough construction office and securing grant money to support public safety programs and environmental initiatives.

Connelly is a graduate of the College of St. Elizabeth and Fairleigh Dickinson University. She currently serves as Vice-Chairperson of the Board of Trustees of Benedictine Academy and was selected 1992 Alumna of the Year.

Walsh is most recently known for his opposition to the controversial 100 foot monopole and for providing pro bono legal services to the anti-monopole citizens group.

In 1990, while serving as Chairperson of the Administration and Finance Committee, Walsh delivered a Borough budget with the lowest dollar increase in Union County. He has also opposed both the developers and state on high density housing for Fanwood.

Walsh is an attorney with offices in New York and New Jersey. He is a graduate of Iona College, City College of New York and Brooklyn Law School.

Former Mayor Patricia M. Kuran, who served as 1992 campaign manager stated "I expected them to win. They were the most experienced and, by far, the best qualified candidates."

### Former Scotch Plains-Fanwood Board of Education member dies

Former Scotch Plains-Fanwood Board of Education member, George T. Esposito died this past Friday in the Runnells Specialized Hospital in Berkeley Heights. Mr. Esposito had been a Fanwood resident since 1935. He was elected to the Board in 1990 and served until this past spring when he resigned due to failing health.

Mr. Esposito was a professional educator having taught business and vocational subjects at both Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School and Abraham Clark High School in Roselle. He had taught business education subjects at Union County College for the past four years. A 1950 graduate of Trenton State College, Esposito received a

master's degree in 1952 from Columbia University. He also served in the Navy during World War II and belonged to Post 209 of the American Legion in Scotch Plains.

Former Fanwood Mayor Patricia M. Kuran offered the following remembrances: "To know George Esposito was to raise one's opinion of a
