## Ground broken at senior housing project

Scotch Plains Mayor Joan Papan and Senior Citizen Housing Chairman Frank Cleminshaw presided at the official ground-breaking ceremony last Friday at the intersection of Lake and Martine Avenues where a new senior citizen housing project will be constructed.

The project, which is expected to be completed in about 18 months, will consist of 111 rental apartments, 97 of which will be one bedroom units and the other 14 two bedroom quarters. The average monthly rental will be \$600.00 and all qualified applicants that are accepted will pay rent based on 30% of their monthly income.

Scotch Plains residents will be given preference wherever possible. Anyone interested in Senior Housing should address a letter of interest to Mayor Joan

be about 8 months before the complex is completed, those who wrote in will be notified.

The facility will cost \$7.5 million and the
